# EUpVET

- European Association of national, regional or sectoral representative VET providers organisations
- Member Organisations are relatively independent
- Cooperation with other European Associations, as there are EfVET, EVTA & EVBB
- EUpVET and other organisations want to contribute as providers organisations to the Europe 2020 objectives by participating in the various European platforms and initiatives

# Joint Policy Declaration to emphasise the importance of:

- Lifelong Learning strategy that integrates knowledge, practical skills, experience and learning outcomes
- Implementation of existing instruments that promote cooperation between Education providers, labour market agencies, local authorities and social partners
- Secure VET as a career path as well as one of the instruments for social cohesion

# Joint Policy Declaration to emphasise the importance of:

- Link Vocational Education and Training with complementary initiatives and services
- View Vocational Education and Training as a public interest service
- Promote transnational mobility in Vocational Education and Training

# EQAVET

Quality Assurance is crucial for:

- Attractiveness and status of VET
- Success of Lifelong Learning strategies
- Parity of esteem with other education sectors
- Quality of teachers
- Integrated and accredited mobility pathways
- Open European Learning Area for VET
- Mutual trust
- Coherence of EQF, ECVET, EQARF, Europass etc.

# Engagement EUproVET and other VET associations

Participation in European Commission working groups:

- Expert group about Quality of in-company training and teaching (CEDEFOP)
- Expert group about Excellence in VET involving stakeholders to develop “Green, SMART, Inclusive and Sustainable VET”.
- Other working groups, like mobility

# VET providers' commitment

- Cooperate with the European Commission, National Governments and Social Partners to contribute to the ambitions of the Bruges Communiqué, including the Flagships
- Cooperate with all European networks, including the social partners
- Involving the providers at an early stage increases the feasibility and the commitment and bridges the gap between policy preparation (EC) and policy implementation (providers)
